## INTRODUCTION

## DISCUSSION STARTER

1. We all know that Stuart's favorite Christmas album is the Jackson 5 Christmas album. What is your favorite Christmas song/album?
2. Stuart explained that music is a part of every civilization and most of the big moments of our lives such as birthdays, holidays and even when we fall in love. Why is music so powerful? Why do we connect with certain songs and play them over and over?

## EVALUATE IT

1. Answer the question Stuart asked in the opening of his sermon, "Part of our church experience every week when we come together is that we sing songs. Why do we do that?"
2. Read Luke 2:8-14. Why do angels choose to sing after announcing the birth of Jesus to the shepherds?
3. Read Luke 1:46-56. Of all the ways Mary could have responded, why does she chose a song? What is the central theme of her song?
4. One of Jesus' many titles is Savior. He is called our Savior because He saved us from our sin, and that means we failed and needed to be saved. How does it make you feel to call Jesus your Savior? Why do you think that is such a hurdle for some?
